

Life in Tilburg is relatively cheap compared to other Dutch university cities. Living costs are between \notin 760 and \notin 860 per month. TUITION FEES

Tilburg University receives state funding for students who are citizens of countries within the European Economic Area (EEA). Different tuition fees therefore apply to EEA and non-EEA citizens. The tuition fees for 2013-2014 were not yet determined at the time of publishing. To give you an idea of our tuition fees, in 2012-2013 EEA and Swiss students paid \in 1,771 for a full academic year, and non-EEA students paid a maximum of \in 10,590. Tilburg University provides a number of scholarships for outstanding international students who are admitted to a Master's program. The Tilburg University Scholarship for Academic Excellence often consists of a partial tuition fee waiver (for non-EEA students) plus, in many cases, a contribution towards living expenses for one academic year.
